

# HLNSC COVID Code of Conduct for Students

As a result of the COVID-19 outbreak, we require all students who return to College in person to observe an additional set of rules designed to ensure that all members of the College community are kept safe.

This includes respecting social distancing rules and interacting with other members of the College community and the general public in a safe and appropriate way.

Students will be required to agree to the code of conduct below. If the code of conduct is broken at any time, the student may be subject to disciplinary action.



**YOU MUST STRICTLY FOLLOW GOVERNMENT REQUIREMENTS TO SELF-ISOLATE. IF YOU OR A MEMBER OF YOUR HOUSEHOLD HAS ANY SYMPTOMS OF SUSPECTED COVID YOU MUST NOT COME INTO COLLEGE.**

## We expect you to:

- Wear your ID badge at all times to identify you as a student enrolled at the College.
- Follow the rules about regular handwashing on arrival to college and throughout the day. Please use the supplied hand sanitiser to ensure good hygiene is maintained at all times.
- Make every effort to respect social distancing rules to keep you and all other members of the College community safe whilst on campus.
- Attend College for the purposes of attending lessons or accessing study space at your designated times only. Being on the College site purely for social purposes is not allowed.
- Observe strict social distancing when travelling to and from College and demonstrate behaviour that shows respect to members of the general public and other members of the College community at all times.
- Keep moving in the corridors and go straight into your classroom. If you cannot enter immediately, please wait 2m from others.
- Wear the personal protective equipment provided where it is not possible to remain 2m away from staff, e.g for practical demonstrations or study skill support etc.
- Wear a face covering when moving around the College in all public spaces where students and staff mix. For example, corridors, refectory and LRC etc. You can remove your face covering to eat/drink in the refectory and when in class. We know that some people may have medical or health reasons where they may not be able to wear a face covering. If this is the case, please inform your tutor.
- Dispose of your temporary face covering in a covered bin or place reusable face coverings in a plastic bag you can seal. Take care not to touch the front of your face covering. When you have removed your face covering, please wash or sanitise your hands.

## We will not accept:

- Failure to comply with any of the guidelines above.
- Disrespect to or failure to comply with any instructions issued by a member of staff.
- Any actions that break health and safety or rules of place any member of the College community or general public at risk.

## Additional guidance to protect yours and others' safety:

- Only bring equipment to college that is essential and do not share this equipment with others.
- Students are permitted to leave the College campus during the day but are asked to limit their interaction with as few people as possible. This is to respect members of the college and the community as well as keeping you safe.
- If you are able you should not travel to College earlier than needed and you should return home once lessons are finished for the day.
- If you need to wait until the start of lesson or between lessons we recommend you wait outside, staying socially distanced.
