The health, wellbeing and safety of our staff and students remains our key priority as we move out of the Covid-19 pandemic. All students are expected to act in a responsible manner and there is an additional set of rules designed to ensure that all members of the College community are kept safe.

We expect you to:

- Wear your ID badge at all times to identify you as a student enrolled at the College.
- Follow the rules about regular handwashing throughout the day and use the supplied hand sanitizer to ensure good hygiene is maintained at all times.
- Adhere to classroom seating plans. This will allow us to identify close contacts in the event of a Covid-19 positive
 case.
- Show respect to the College community and wear a face covering when directed to do so.
- Adhere to the number restrictions on lifts and toilets. These will be clearly signposted.
- Continue to social distance outside of the classroom wherever possible. This is help keep you and all other members of the College community safe whilst on campus.
- Demonstrate behaviour that shows respect to members of the general public and other members of the College
 community at all times. Failure to comply with this will be considered as bringing the College into disrepute and
 may result in immediate suspension from College.

- Disrespect to or failure to comply with any instructions issued by a member of staff.
- Any actions that break health and safety or rules of place any member of the College community or general public at risk.
